

10 Frequently Asked Questions

<p>What is the fall blooming, fragrant shrub on the bandstand?</p>	<p>Elaeagnus pungens. It can also be found along the boardwalk at Central Ave. and 2nd Street. This shrub grows very quickly and requires regular trimming to keep under control.</p>	
<p>What is the tree located on the bandstand covered in blue flowers during July?</p>	<p>Vitex (Chaste Tree). It can also be found at Centennial Park. This tree is often confused with a butterfly bush.</p>	
<p>When should I prune knock out roses?</p>	<p>Late winter to early spring is the general rule. However, we have pruned them earlier in the winter without any problem.</p>	
<p>When do you plant tulip bulbs?</p>	<p>We plant tulips in Mid-November. One person drills the hole with an augur and another follows behind placing the tulip bulb in the hole.</p>	
<p>What is the summer flowering tree found throughout the town?</p>	<p>Crape Myrtle. It comes in various colors, shapes, and sizes. It is NOT hardy in northern states.</p>	
<p>How often do you fertilize the hanging baskets?</p>	<p>We start with a slow release fertilizer incorporated in the soil mix. This is supplemented by a weekly dose of liquid fertilizer starting mid-summer.</p>	
<p>Do you water the hanging baskets every day?</p>	<p>Yes!!! There is a large amount of plant material being supported by a proportionately smaller amount of soil.</p>	

<p>What plants are in the boxes at town hall?</p>	<p>Dragon Wing Begonia is the tall upright plant with pink or red blooms. Silver Falls is the silvery green plant spilling out of the box.</p>	
<p>My petunia plants are healthy, but are not blooming. Why?</p>	<p>One really good possibility is that Tobacco or Geranium Budworms have taken up residency in your plant. These are pesky little caterpillars that devour the flower buds and blooms.</p>	
<p>What's the shrub in front of town hall with yellow flowers?</p>	<p>Hypericum calycinum 'Hidcote'. We treat this shrub like an herbaceous perennial, cutting it to the ground each winter.</p>
