# History

## **Founding**

Bethany was founded by members of the Christian Church (also known as the Disciples of Christ) of Washington DC area and Pennsylvania. The original idea was not to found a Town, but to find a suitable tract of land for a permanent yearly seaside assembly for the Christian churches of the country. Bethany was named by H.L. Atkinson who won a nationwide contest. He was given a lot on the beach as his prize. Bethany still reflects the character of the early settlers who were looking for a haven of rest for quiet people. ”

## **The First Building**

The first building in Bethany was the Tabernacle, an octagonal auditorium on the assembly grounds of the Christian Missionary Society. It was dedicated July 12, 1901, though still uncompleted. It had brown shingles and was 100 feet in diameter with a cupola on top. That same day the deed to the Tabernacle and surrounding 15 acres was presented to Dr. Powers, representing the Christian Missionary Society by the Bethany Beach Improvement Company. The Tabernacle lasted 60 years until storms and termites destroyed the building.


## **Obstacles Overcome**

Problems soon arose. A railroad had been promised but not delivered, water was poor, and rains poured into the Auditorium. As a result, the officers of the Bethany Beach Improvement Company were fired.



Six businessmen from Pittsburgh were sent to bail them out. In the fall of 1902, they bought up the company, moved to the Beach and put their stamp on development for years to come. These men included W.R. Errett, lawyer; John M. Addy, plumber; W.S. Kidd, steel manufacturer; R.S. Latimer, tea merchant; Dr. T.E. Cramblet, president of Bethany College in WV; and W.A. Dinker, the first president of the new company.

## Overview

The 24-foot statue at the downtown entrance to Bethany Beach has been a landmark since 1976. The original statue was created by sculptor Peter Wolf Toth, a humanitarian who wanted to give thanks to the United States.

The sculpture was donated to the Town as part of his "Trail of the Whispering Giants" project. He created more than 50 wooden sculptures of famous Indians and donated at least one to every state. He also has some located in Canada.

# Handicap Beach Access

## **Handicap Beach Wheelchairs**

In order to accommodate those with a handicap who desire to leave the boardwalk and enjoy the beach, the Town of Bethany Beach has specially made wheelchairs capable of maneuvering in sandy conditions.

The wheelchairs are light in weight and have large smooth tires that allow the wheelchairs to ride on the surface of sand, instead of typically miring down in sand. The wheelchairs are operated manually by the occupant and with possible assistance of a family member or friend.

# Parking

# Trolley Services

Trolleys run from the Friday before Memorial Day through mid September, continuously between 9:30 am to 10:00 pm. (Note: Last pick up on Atlantic and Garfield is at 9:45 pm) The trolley leaves location #1 on the half hour starting at 9:30 am. There may be little or no service daily 12:30 pm to 1:00 pm and 7:00 pm to 7:30 pm (approximate times) due to a lunch break.

You can flag down the trolley anywhere along the route for pick-up or discharge, except on Route 26 and Route 1. No pick-up or drop-off on Jefferson Bridge Road or Rt 26.

The trolley fare is 25 cents each way. The driver does not make change. For more information, please call 302-539-8011. **Please note that the trolley no longer stops at the Lake Bethany entrance or the South Coastal Library.**


# Emergency Management Services

## Code Red



The Town of Bethany Beach has upgraded its emergency notification system. The Town is now using the CodeRED Emergency Notification System and it is an ultra high-speed telephone communication service for emergency notifications and the distribution of information considered to be important.

This system allows us to telephone all or targeted areas of the Town in case of an emergency situation that requires immediate action, such as an evacuation, contaminated water, hazardous chemical spill, etc. This system is capable of dialing the entire Town within minutes. It then delivers a pre-recorded message describing the situations to a live person or an answering machine in the affected area, possibly including instructions requiring immediate action on the part of the recipient.



# Free Bulk Trash Cleanup

Free Cleanup is the last two weeks of April and October.

Bulk trash will be picked up free during these weeks. Leave it out where you normally leave your garbage, and Public Works will dispose of it at their convenience. There is no need to notify Town Hall.

This does not include construction material, hazardous materials, paints or explosives. Limbs/branches must be cut into six-foot lengths tied into bundles and the doors must be removed from major appliances.

Any other time of year there will be a fee at the discretion of the Public Works Director. Please call Town Hall, (302) 539-8011, for arrangements.

Note: It is recommended that plastic bag liners be used in all residential garbage cans to increase efficiency in collection and to reduce breeding of flies and mosquitoes.

# Water Department

The Water Department is responsible for the operation and maintenance of the Town's water facilities. These facilities are staffed by State licensed operators and consist of the following:

- Water filtration plant and standpipe on Collins Street
- Six production wells
- Entire distribution system

Raw water is pumped from the wells to the water treatment plant. Water passes through numerous treatment processes at the plant.

# New Water Service

## Guidelines for Establishing a New Water Service

- Obtain a Town water permit from Town Hall (214 Garfield Parkway, Ph: (302) 539-8011)

- All applicable fees and costs must be paid at this time
  - The following is an outline of these fees:
    - Impact Fee
    - Tapping Fee
    - Water Meter Fee
    - Meter Pit Fee
    - Fittings Fee
    - Inspection

- The water main tap is done by Town personnel. Meter and pit installation is done by a licensed plumber, and must be inspected by the Town of Bethany Beach
- A 72-hours notice must be given to the Water Department regarding date and time of installation.
- Meter, pit and fittings are to be picked up at the Water Plant by your plumber on the day of installation. A time of inspection will be agreed upon at time of pick-up.
- All water meters and pits will be installed at or near the property line.

# Ambulance Services

The BBVFC Emergency Medical Services Division is an unprecedented collaboration between the fire company and property owners within the Towns of Bethany Beach, South Bethany, Fenwick Island and the Sea Colony Recreation Association (the sponsors). The financial commitment of these sponsors and others allowed for service to begin operation on December 31st, 2008.

The primary ambulance is staffed 24 hours a day, 365 days a year by a team of seven career Firefighter/Emergency Medical Technicians, Part-Time EMT's and an EMS Supervisor.



# Fishing

Delaware now has fishing license requirements covering all of the state's waters. That means the new license covers both fresh and/or tidal water—and for the first time, it also covers both Delaware residents and non-residents who are fishing tidal waters.

The Delaware license for both fresh and tidal waters is also valid for recreational crabbing and clamming. There are new fees for charter boats and head boats, and an option for a recreational boat fishing license.

Residents age 16 to 64 inclusive, and non-residents 16 and older, need a license.

# State Parks

## **Delaware Seashore State Park**

Delaware Seashore State Park is located north of Bethany Beach on Delaware Route 1. It is open from 8:00 am to sunset, year-round. This park offers six miles of ocean and bay shoreline, a campground, 295-slip marina with charter, head boat, and a boat ramp.

## **Fenwick Island State Park**

Fenwick Island State Park is located three and one-half miles south of Bethany Beach on Delaware Route 1. It offers 355 acres of ocean and bay shorelines. During the season, guarded beaches are provided with restroom facilities, a bathhouse, and food stand.

## **Great Cypress Swamp**

Great Cypress Swamp is located on the border between Delaware and Maryland. It provided materials for shelter in 19th century. The swamp is home to seventy-three breeding species of birds. Located West of Selbyville, DE and Highway 54/113, covers about 50 square miles and about 20 miles SW of Bethany Beach.

# State Parks (Cont)

## **Holts Landing State Park**

Holts Landing State Park is located on the south shore of the Indian River Bay and 12 miles northwest of Bethany. Take Route 26 west from Bethany Beach and turn right on County Road 346 to the park entrance.

The park is a 203-acre Delaware state park located northwest of Bethany Beach, Sussex County, Delaware. Prior to becoming a state park, the land was the Holt family farm. The Holts sold the land to the state of Delaware in 1957 and Holts Landing State Park was opened to the public in 1965. Holts Landing State Park is open for year-round recreation and features the only pier on the east coast of Delaware that was built for crabbing and the recreational harvesting of blue crabs. It has a pavilion for picnics, boat ramp, horseshoe pits, playground, and ball fields. It also offers clamming and crabbing.

The park is open from 8:00 am to sunset, year-round.

## James Farm Ecological Preserve

James Farm Ecological Preserve is located on Cedar Neck Road about five miles northwest of Bethany Beach.

The park provides guided tours, demonstrations, and various exhibits. You can walk through the woods and learn about native Delaware birds, trees, wildflowers, and shrubs. The James Farm provides three observation towers and a number of clearly marked trails on its 150 acres along Indian River Bay.

Center for the Inland Bays (CIB) operates the James Farm. Admission is free.
